WOODBINE RECEIVES \$250,000 IN NJDOT BIKEWAYS FUNDING

Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that the New Jersey Department of Transportation Local Bikeway Program has awarded the Borough of Woodbine a grant in the amount of \$250,000.

This project, Woodbine Bikeway Project—Phase 4B, is a bicycle /pedestrian trail that will be constructed adjacent to the Cape May County Seashore Line railroad tracks within the Woodbine Municipal Airport boundaries. It will extend from the Cape May Seashore Line railtracks approximately 2200 feet south of Route 550 to the intersection of the Cape May Seashore Line and Woodbine Municipal Border with Dennis Township. This will give Woodbine approximately six miles total of bicycle/pedestrian pathways.

This phase has already been designed and engineered and is now ready to be put out to bid.

“NJDOT has shown a commitment to principles that complement Smart Growth and the role of transportation in promoting Smart Growth initiative; the completion of Woodbine’s bikepath system will help achieve this goal and pursue their transportation strategy of providing mobility while preserving the natural beauty of our state,” noted Mayor Pikolycky.
