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BIDS RECEIVED FOR TWO WOODBINE NJDOT PROJECTS

Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that bids were received October 15 for two projects funded by New Jersey Department of Transportation grants.

The first project is to construct improvements to enhance pedestrian and vehicular safety along the Route 550 corridor. Grant funding was for \$200,000. Bidders were: Bud Concrete, Sewell, \$134,281.25; Diamond Construction, Brick, \$197,293; Charles Marandino, Milmay, \$125,148; Lexa Concrete, Vineland, \$174,030.20.

The second project, with funding in the amount of \$275,000 from the Safe Routes to Schools Program, would include sidewalk signalization, bike racks, crossing guards, school safety program. Bidders were: Bud Concrete, Sewell, \$170,435.50; Diamond Construction, Brick, \$205,621; Lexa Concrete, Vineland, \$203,250.92; Charles Maradino, Milmay, \$151,372.90; Stone Concrete, Egg Harbor Township, \$254,041.50.

“We anticipate that the contracts will be awarded at the November 5 Borough Council meeting,” added Mayor Pikolycky. “These projects will provide our schoolchildren and other pedestrians with safer walking conditions throughout our community.”
