ARBOR SET FOR APRIL 12 IN WOODBINE

Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that the Borough of Woodbine will again be holding its Arbor Day celebration in conjunction with its annual Student Government Day on April 12, when the eighth grade students of Woodbine Elementary School visit the Municipal Building to learn how local government functions.

As part of the Arbor (and Earth) Day commemoration, tubeling trees will be given out that day to both the students and any residents who come into Borough Hall. These trees will also be distributed through the Sam Azeez Museum and the Woodbine Branch of the County Library. These tube-seedlings are provided through the New Jersey Forest Service, Community Forestry Program.

“As we have combined Arbor Day with the students’ visit, we mark this event as our “swing into spring” as both young residents and young trees pick up our spirits for another season. Several years ago, we experimentally planted several of these tubelings in a container behind Borough Hall, and the time has finally come to replant them as part of our arboreal celebration,” noted Mayor Pikolycky.
