### **WOODBINE COMPLETE STREETS/SAFE ROUTES INITIATIVES RECOGNIZED**

**Woodbine**—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that the Borough of Woodbine received a letter of congratulations from a State-wide Coalition of organizations concerned with bicycle and pedestrian safety. Woodbine was applauded for its adoption of a Complete Streets resolution and the accompanying policies that have made it a leader within the New Jersey Complete Streets movement. Woodbine is the sixth municipality in Cape May County to be recognized as a Complete Streets Community and one of only 58 throughout the State.

At the same time, Woodbine Elementary School was featured in the Spring 2013 edition of EasyRider, the official publication of Cross County Connection. The school had partnered with Cross County Connection in instituting a Safe Routes to Schools Program, which included the creation of a School Travel Plan and the institutionalization of a Walking Bus Program. These actions help in the educating of students and their parents on walking and biking safety, encourages safe and active commuting habits while promoting student health.

"I am proud too that the program at the school was nominated by Safe Routes to Schools Coordinator Dave Calderetti as a Silver Level award recipient for the statewide Safe Routes to School Recognition Program," added Mayor Pikolycky.
