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WOODBINE GOING OUT TO BID ON \$400,000 FIREHOUSE RENOVATION PROJECT

Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that the Borough of Woodbine has received authorization from the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs to go out to bid on its Fire House renovation project. Bids will be opened on June 11 at 10:30 a.m. at the Woodbine Municipal Building.

A non-mandatory, pre-bid conference will take place on Friday, May 29, 2015, at 10 am at the Woodbine Municipal Building at 501 Washington Avenue, with a walk thru of the site to follow.

The Borough received \$400,000 from the DCA Small Cities Public Facilities program for renovation to the Woodbine Fire Station complex.

Renovations and improvements will include reconstruction of the roof on both the 1903 and 1950s sections of the Fire Station and completing interior and exterior repair to areas compromised as a result of roof conditions.

“Our historic Station will continue to be of ongoing use and importance as it serves its appointed purpose, while the health and safety of the community will be served by making these upgrades to our century-old Woodbine Fire Station,” noted Mayor Pikolycky. “I want to thank the Department of Community Affairs for funding, which enables us to keep this facility properly maintained.”
