WOODBINE FILES APPLICATIONS TOTALLING NEARLY \$600,000 FOR NJDOT FUNDING

Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that the Borough of Woodbine submitted two applications, totaling nearly \$ 600,000, to the New Jersey Department of Transportation Municipal Aid program for grant funding for infrastructure projects.

The first application, in the amount of \$346,398.75 is for the maintenance and upgrading of the Woodbine Bikeway from Grant Avenue to Fidler Hill Road.

After twelve years of extensive mixed use, there is a need to upgrade as well as widen the present bikepath to 14 feet to accommodate the conflict that occurs between the various usages (pedestrians, bicycles).

The second application, in the amount of \$243, 296, is for the reconstruction of parts of Heilprin and Sumner Avenues.

This would include installation of stormwater facilities to correct recurring flooding problems, which would complement a County road and drainage project which is scheduled for neighboring Webster Street.

“We thank NJDOT for all their past assistance which has allowed infrastructure repair and upgrade in the Borough without further financial burden on our taxpayers in this time of economic challenge,” remarked Mayor Pikolycky.
