WOODBINE ADVERTISING TWO CAPITOL IMPROVEMENTS PROJECTS TOTTALLING \$300,000 FOR BID

Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that Woodbine Borough Council, at its December 6 meeting, has authorized going out to bid on two construction projects, totaling \$300,000.

The first, funded by New Jersey Department of Transportation discretionary aid, was for upgrading and paving of Sherman Avenue, which currently a dirt and gravel road which is one of the last unpaved municipal roads in the Borough. It connects with County Route 660 (Fidler Hill Road). This roadway is utilized by Borough residents. Construction of a new road surface and drainage system will provide improved access to not only the neighboring residents but will aid local traffic as well as emergency personnel.

The second, funded by a Department of Community Affairs Small Cities program, is for work at the Community Center, including retrofitting of airconditioning, asphaltting of the parking lot, and handicapped accessibility work.

“We anticipating receiving and awarding these bids sometime in January,” added Mayor Pikolycky.
