WOODBINE AWARDED \$140,00 FROM NJDOT

Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that the New Jersey Department of Transportation Municipal Aid program has awarded the Borough of Woodbine a grant in the amount of \$140,000 for reconstruction of portions of Franklin Street and Clay Street.

This project will be an extension of previous DOT Local Aid projects. Both Clay Street and Franklin Street are immediately adjacent to the proposed third phase of the Washington Avenue streetscape project. Franklin and Clay are busy routes adjacent to the town center and provide access from the adjoining residential neighborhoods, serving as major access routes between a residential zone and the town center.

“I again thank the Department of Transportation for acknowledging Woodbine’s continuing infrastructure upgrade initiatives through the awarding of this grant funding which will allow us to move forward with our program to improve the safety of our residents along these major access routes without the burden of additional cost to our taxpayers,” added Mayor Pikolycky.
