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WOODBINE RECEIVES \$91,000 FOR EMERGENCY GENERATOR

Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that the New Jersey Department of Law and Public Safety, Division of State Police, has informed the Borough of Woodbine that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has awarded the Borough of Woodbine a Hazard Mitigation grant for a generator project through the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program—Energy Allocation Initiative, with a Federal share of \$75,000 and a State share of \$16,000, for a total project of \$91,000.

This grant will be used to purchase a generator for the use of the municipal complex.

The Energy Allocation Initiative is intended to support efforts to encourage enhanced energy resilience for critical assets and facilities in New Jersey. This program will allow communities such as the Borough of Woodbine to pursue technical innovation by harnessing the resources of the State's energy, environmental, and emergency management agencies and the perspective of the U.S. Department of Energy's subject matter experts.

“Woodbine is located in one of the highest spots in Cape May County. While we do not face the same flooding dangers, it remains important to provide Borough residents with a safe environment during emergency situations. This generator will allow vital operations to continue thus putting us in a stronger position from a standpoint of keeping communications and response going during times of power failure at our municipal facilities due to natural disasters and the like,” added Mayor Pikolycky.
