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### **WOODBINE APPROVES GENTILINI CHEVROLET AUTO DEALERSHIP RELOCATION AND EXPANSION**

**Woodbine**—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that the Woodbine Planning and Zoning Board, at their October 10 meeting, approved plans for the new Gentilini Family Chevrolet \$4 million automobile retail facility to be built along DeHirsch Avenue (Route 550) between John S. Penn Boulevard and Henry DeCinque Drive, next to the existing Gentilini Ford dealership.

The plans call for a 30,900 square foot automobile dealership to be constructed containing 3,500 square feet of show room, 22 service bays, administrative offices and parts warehouse.

Gentilini Chevrolet will be built on a 9-acre site that will be capable of displaying in excess of 230 vehicles for sale and parking for 40 employees and up to 55 customers at one time.

The new facility will be one the first of General Motors new style of building that is energy efficient and a modern new look, testified Harry S. Harper, project architect. Construction is on schedule to begin early next year.

“This expansion will be an additional component of our Airport Business Park and this will serve to enhance the economic engine for our Borough,” added Mayor Pikolycky. “This is a project long in the planning and we are glad to see it now underway. The Gentilini family has had a presence in Woodbine since 1955 and have been expanding their operations ever since. This means the retention of a business with strong ties in the Borough for generations. I congratulate the Gentilini Family on their approvals and looks forward to the jobs that the construction will provide and the additional employment that this great facility will require.”
