**Woodbine**—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to inform Woodbine residents that the New Jersey Department of Transportation - Office of Bicycle and Pedestrian Programs (NJDOT-OBPP), in partnership with the Borough of Woodbine, is holding a Public Information Open House regarding pedestrian, bicycle, and equestrian access and mobility in the Borough. This would address walking and biking routes to and from both the Community School as well as the recently opened Woodbine branch of the Cape May County library.

The Public Information Open House is scheduled for October 18, 2007 from 4 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. at the Woodbine Municipal Building. All members of the public are invited to stop in to view proposed mapping and routes, and to discuss access and mobility issues with NJDOT and the Borough of Woodbine in an effort to improve transportation safety in the Borough.
