FOUR- DAY CROCHET WORKSHOP AT WOODBINE BRANCH OF CMC LIBRARY

Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that the Cape May County Library will be holding a second four-day crochet workshop at the Woodbine Branch, located at 800 Monroe Street, Woodbine, on four Thursdays, February 12, 19, 26 and March 5, 2015, all from 4 to 6 pm.

A pleasant break in these winter months, participants will learn how to crochet, felt, and sew by crafting either a small purse or an eye glass case. Each technique will lead into the next, and by the end of class not only will the participant have a finished project but also will have learned how to use three different techniques.

The presenter, Jennifer Bolton, learned to crochet from her grandmother, and hopes to pass on the tradition to her three girls. Jennifer has earned a degree in Fine Arts from Montgomery College.

All students will be required to bring 100% wool non-washable yarn in two colors, a large J hook, large eye needle, and scissors.
