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WOODBINE HOLDS PUBLIC HEARING AUGUST 21

Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that the Borough of Woodbine will hold a Public Hearing on August 21, at 3:30 p.m., at the Borough hall, 501 Washington Avenue, concerning the submission of a New Jersey department of Community Affairs Small Cities Public Facilities Application in the amount of \$400,000 to install a new municipal well and to upgrade all Borough recreational playgrounds and the submission of a NJ DCA Housing Rehabilitation Application for \$200,000 for Owner Occupied Housing Rehabilitation.

The Small Cities Housing Rehabilitation Program issues to those eligible “deferred loans”, which are secured by a mortgage note held by the Borough of Woodbine and is repayable when the property is sold. No monthly payments are required nor is interest added.

The purpose of the program is to assist eligible homeowners to address code related items and weatherization needs. The types of repairs covered are electric, plumbing, heating, roof, structural issues, windows, doors, handrails, steps, smoke detectors, CO detectors, and siding. Items are addressed by priority starting with the major systems.

Forms to apply for the Housing Rehabilitation program, which include eligibility guidelines, are available at the Borough Hall.

All citizens are encouraged to attend and offer comments at the Public Hearing or by writing to the Borough, attention Mayor William Pikolycky.
