Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that the Borough of Woodbine has received a 2006 recycling rebate in the amount \$6,575.92 from the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority (CMCMUA).

The CMCMUA provides recycling rebates to the County's municipalities whenever the CMCMUA's share of recycling revenues for the fiscal/calendar year exceeds the cost to operate the Authority's Intermediate Processing Facility (IPF). The receipt of increased quantities of source separated recyclables will not only generate additional market revenues, but will also reduce the cost per ton cost of operating the IPF. Any investment made by a municipality this year to increase the tonnage recycled by that community will pay dividends in terms of higher rebates in 2007. The county recycling goal is 50% of the municipal solid waste stream and 60% of the total solid waste stream.

"Woodbine's 2006 IPF recycling rebate was based on receipt of 364.25 tons of recyclable materials," added Mayor Pikolycky. "Upping our percentage of recycled matter will increase this amount for 2007, while decreasing the amount of waste discarded into the landfill. Being a municipality where two households were recipients of "excellent recycler" awards, I encourage Woodbine to keep up the good work."
