Mr. Sypniewski serves as both Municipal Public Defender and Borough Webmaster.

The students then took a tour of the Municipal Services Building in order to gain a better understanding of how each office functions.

Mayor William Pikolycky concluded the day by giving an overview of municipal government and answering the various questions the students, as residents and future voters, put to him. The Mayor then presented each student with a certificate of attendance.
