WOODBINE HOLD PUBLIC HEARING ON NJDOT TRANSPORTATION APPLICATIONS

Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that the Borough of Woodbine will hold a Public Hearing on June 10, 2014 at 6:30 p.m., in the main meeting room of the municipal services building, 501 Washington Avenue, Woodbine, NJ 08270.

The Borough of Woodbine intends to apply for funding through the NJ Department of Transportation's Transportation Alternative and Safe Routes to School Programs. The Borough will conduct a Public Hearing at which the public will be provided information concerning these Programs and the specific projects for which funds will be requested. Streetscape improvements in the Town Center business district, including Washington Avenue and the block surrounding the Borough Hall Complex, will continue to be the focus of the Borough's efforts through the Transportation Alternative Program. Sidewalk, crosswalk, and signalization improvements will be the priorities for the Safe Routes to School Program. The targeted area would be the neighborhood adjacent to the school. At the Public Hearing, questions and comments from the public will be received.

"I encourage all citizens to attend this hearing to not only provide their input but to get an understanding of the goals of these applications. Woodbine has adopted a state-approved Complete Streets policy and also has been recognized for its Safe Routes to Schools success and sustainability, for which the community has received a Silver level award," added Mayor Pikolycky. "All residents, and representatives of civic organizations and commercial establishments in the Town Center area are invited to attend or to send me written comments."
