WOODBINE TO PARTICIPATE IN SUMMER YOUTH WORK EXPERIENCE PROGRAM

Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce the Borough of Woodbine will again be a participating worksite in the Summer Youth program of the sponsored by the Atlantic Cape May Office of Workforce Development, Training and New Jersey Youth Corps, Youth Unit.

Youth that participate in the program will be between the ages of 17 and 21, who meet eligibility requirements. Enrollment is based upon eligibility and completion of paperwork. (Must be at least 17 years of age, and if enrolled in school, must be entering your Junior year of High School). Youth will earn \$9.25/hour for part-time employment up to 25 hours per week. The program will run from May 4 through September 30, 2015.

All youth deemed eligible will be required to complete an Academic Assessment and participate in Work Readiness Classes. Youth assessed as Basic Skills Deficient must attend (paid) Academic Tutorial Classes. Students will be paid while attending class.

Those interested in participating are asked to contact the Municipal Clerk at the Borough Hall Mondays through Fridays between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. Any questions, contact the Clerk's office at 861-2153.

"I encourage any age-eligible individuals to apply for this program," added Mayor Pikolycky. "It will be a good opportunity to develop necessary employment skills while earning."
