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WOODBINE RECEIVES BIDS FOR USDA-FUNDED COMMUNITY FOOD BANK FACILITY

Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce the Borough of Woodbine received two bids for its Public Safety building upgrades on September 25.

Bidders were: Coastal Land Contractors, \$35,652; Turtle Construction: \$13,599.09.

The United State Department of Agriculture—Rural Development awarded the Borough funding in the amount of \$55,864 for needed facility improvements to the Public Safety building, which is used monthly by Community Food Bank of New Jersey food distribution site in Woodbine.

The Borough of Woodbine's Public Safety Building located on DeHirsch Avenue serves as a home for the Borough Emergency Management operation. The Borough has offered the use of the first floor of its Public Safety Building to the Food Bank through an existing partnership between the First Baptist Church and the Community Food Bank of New Jersey. Food distribution to needy families in Woodbine was being conducted by the Church as their previous location. Currently, this arrangement is minimally operational since space is extremely limited at their new site.

“We expect to be awarding this contract at the October 2 Council meeting,” added Mayor Pikolycky.
