WOODBINE AWARDS CONTRACT FOR USDA-FUNDED COMMUNITY FOOD DISTRIBUTION LOCATION

Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce the Borough of Woodbine awarded a contract to Turtle Construction of Swedesboro for its Public Safety building upgrades at its October 2 meeting.

A preconstruction meeting is scheduled for October 16, 2014.

The United State Department of Agriculture—Rural Development awarded the Borough funding in the amount of \$20,000 for needed facility improvements to the Public Safety building, which is used monthly by Community Food Bank of New Jersey food distribution site in Woodbine.

The Borough of Woodbine's Public Safety Building located on DeHirsch Avenue serves as a home for the Borough Emergency Management operation. The Borough has offered the use of the first floor of its Public Safety Building to the Food Bank through an existing partnership between the First Baptist Church and the Community Food Bank of New Jersey. Food distribution to needy families was being conducted by the Church as their previous location.

"We look forward to starting the upgrades by the end of the month," added Mayor Pikolycky. "The program will continue during this process."
