### **WOODBINE MUNICIPAL AIRPORT RECEIVED NJDOT FUNDS**

Woodbine, NJ—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce the Woodbine Municipal Airport has been selected to receive Grants from the New Jersey Department of Transportation's Airport Improvement/Airport Safety Fund Programs for four projects, totaling \$732,209.65

These come on the heels of a recent \$166,250 award for Runway Safety Improvements at the airport

The first Grant, in the amount of \$71,250, is for Apron and Taxiway Crack Repair and Seal Coating. This project will improve and prolong the useful life of these pavements.

The second Grant, in the amount of \$309,323.80, is for Perimeter Fence Phase II construction. This project will continue Woodbine Municipal Airport's efforts to provide greater security at the airport

The third Grant, in the amount of \$90,250, is for the Installation of a Beacon Tower. This project will provide the airport with a new rotating beacon. The beacon helps pilots find the airport at night and during low visibility conditions.

The fourth Grant, in the amount of \$261,385.85, will provide funds for 15 acres of Stump and Brush Removal. This removal will provide for the removal of stumps and brush on all runway approaches.

"This gives us a total grant award of \$900,000 for airport improvements. We thank NJDOT for their commitment to providing assistance for State General Aviation airports such as Woodbine thus allowing us to maintain our local aviation transportation network," added Mayor Pikolycky.
