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WOODBINE MUNICIPAL AIRPORT APPLIES FOR FAA CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT FUNDING

Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce the Woodbine Port Authority made application to the Federal Aviation Administration for three capital improvement projects (CIP) for this fiscal year, totaling \$427,310.80.

The first was for Taxiway A Repair, rehabilitation and reconstruction of a section of this taxiway (amount requested \$79,617.19). The intent of this project is to repair severe pavement distress, protect the pavement section from further degradation, and act as a first phase toward a more comprehensive rehabilitation program.

The second was for Obstruction Removal Construction which would serve to remove brush, stumps, etc. so that the Port Authority can better maintain a safer area (amount requested \$273,485.30).

The third was for Design and Permitting for a Helicopter Parking Area. As there are no designated spots for helicopters to park this would fund a study to determine where best to locate and establish a parking apron (amount requested \$74,207.59).

“The airport has also requested funding from the New Jersey Department of Transportation, Aeronautic Division, for funding in the amount of approximately \$400,000 to help leverage these FAA applications,” added Mayor Pikolycky.
