WOODBINE SCHEDULES BID OPENINGS FOR TWO ROADWAY RECONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that Woodbine Borough Council, at their April 2 meeting, authorized going out for bids for two projects, with bid openings scheduled for April 23, 2009.

The first is for the reconstruction of portions of Franklin Street between Washington and Adams Avenues, including roadway reconstruction, concrete sidewalks, and concrete gutters. This project is being funded under a \$46,000 grant from the New Jersey Department of Transportation's Transportation Trust Fund. Bid opening will be at 10 a.m.

The second project is for reconstruction of the entrance road to the Woodbine Municipal Airport (Henry DeCinque Boulevard), including roadway reconstruction, concrete curbs, and drainage work. It is also being funded under a New Jersey Department of Transportation's Transportation Trust Fund Airport Safety Fund, grant in the amount of \$221,674.

The Airport Gateway Entrance Road Rehabilitation is for rehabilitation of the airport gateway entrance road at Henry DeCinque Boulevard. Besides upgrading, there is also a need to extend this roadway towards the north to accommodate future growth of the airport and to provide for the additional business development and aviation demands associated with this Airport Business Park.

"The current project on Franklin Street will be the completion of this project as originally planned, and be a part of our streetscape initiative," noted Mayor Pikolycky. "The roadway at the Airport Entrance area will bring additional focus to our Business Park at the same time making the necessary upgrades that will be needed to continue development of the Business Park. Included in this work will be establishment of a Business Park entrance, the widening of the shoulder, and reconstruction of approximately 1000 feet of roadway."
