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### **WOODBINE GOING OUT TO BID ON UPGRADE TO PUBLIC SAFETY BUILDING**

**Woodbine**—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce the Borough of Woodbine is soliciting bids for certain upgrades to the Public Safety Building, bids to be opened on Tuesday, June 19, at 10 am in the Municipal Services Building, 501 Washington Avenue, Woodbine, NJ 08270.

Bid specifications are on file and may be obtained from the Borough Clerk.

Funding for this activity was made possible by a \$37,400 grant from the United State Department of Agriculture—Rural Development USDA for Phase II improvements to enhance the overall utility and functionality of the former Ambulance/Rescue Squad building, which is now designated the Public Safety Building.

Previous work was funded by a USDA grant in the amount of \$15,000.

The project would include: (Primary bid)--1<sup>st</sup> floor block elevation: stucco exterior of building (approximately 2,100 sq. ft.); Widen two doorways to ADA specifications and replace two existing exterior doors with ADA-complaint steel doors, crash bars, keypads, and Exit signage.

Possible added line items, if funding permits, would include: install two replacement windows for the east elevation, in place or small steel windows with vinyl awning units to spec 6 set in mortar; Purchase and install air-cooled condensing unit, 36,000 BTU, 13 SEER cooling efficiency; Purchase new 30-gallon, 3,800 watts water heater; Install tile flooring in bathroom; Prepare and paint concrete floor (approximately 1,650 sq. ft.) with heavy-duty floor coating

“This Public Safety Building is utilized for various activities and services benefitting the whole community, for example the rabies clinic, food distribution, election site, and emergency management,” added Mayor Pikolycky.
