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BID RECEIVED FOR TWO PROJECTS

Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that the Borough of Woodbine received bids for two major projects, on September 23, 2009.

The first is for replacement of Borough Well #7. The installation of this new municipal well will ensure adequate public water for the community and its residential and commercial properties, as well as for the Woodbine Developmental Center Complex.

Bidders were: AC Schultes, Inc, Woodbury: \$171,100; Layne Christensen, Co., Beverly: \$229,693; Uni-Tech Drilling Co., Inc., Franklinville: \$174,898.

The second component is to improve upon the Borough's various outdoor recreational facilities in Lincoln Park and the Franklin Street Playground that are in need of upgrades to today's standards and regulations. Bidders were: Albrecht & Heun, Cape May Court House: \$219,673.50; Highway Safety Systems, Hammonton: \$274,860; Mathis Construction Co., Little Egg Harbor: \$288,078.70; Ricky Slade Construction, Bridgeton: \$251,195.40; Warriner's Construction, Egg Harbor Twp.: \$313,377.

Funding, in the amount of \$500,000, divided between these two projects, was awarded by the Department of Community Affairs Small Cities Public Facilities Program.

"We anticipate that contracts will be awarded at the October 1 Borough Council meeting," noted Mayor Pikolycky. "As these bids came in lower than anticipated, the Borough will be able to address all of the Recreation Commission's requests for this project."
