WOODBINE COMMUNITY CELEBRATES "THE PLACES YOU'LL GO"

Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky wishes a Happy 106nd Birthday to Dr. Seuss—along with a Happy 107rd to the Borough of Woodbine.

As guest readers join the students and teachers at Woodbine Elementary School on March 2 to celebrate "Read Across America", an annual event both honoring Dr. Seuss (aka Theodor Seuss Geisel) and encouraging reading, the Borough also commemorates the anniversary of its incorporation, which occurred on March 3, 1903.

This year's theme will be based on Seuss's book "Oh, The Places You'll Go". The day will begin with an assembly at 9:15 a.m., followed by the guest readers going to the pre-K through fourth grade classrooms for storytime. This event will be the kick-off for the school's Reading Incentive Program to "unplug and read 15 minutes a day".

"Make the day complete at home by reading with the child or children in your life," urges Mayor Pikolycky, "and let's hope we don't have a Seuss Day snow closing like we did last year, although that proved to be an unexpected curl up and read opportunity.
