Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that the Borough of Woodbine will be receiving \$4,168.94 under the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection's Clean Communities Program. Woodbine has received a total of \$30,966 over the past several years.

New Jersey Clean Communities is a statewide litter-abatement program created by the passage of the Clean Communities Act in 1986 and managed by the New Jersey Dept. of Treasury, New Jersey Dept. of Environmental Protection and the New Jersey Clean Communities Council. Supported by a network of 559 eligible municipalities and twenty-one counties, implementing local litter abatement programs, Clean Communities is embraced by businesses, community organizations, schools and individuals who work together to keep New Jersey clean.

"This is another way of educating our population on not only as to how important it is to keep our community clean, but also on the importance of protecting the natural environment," noted Mayor Pikolycky.
