Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that the Borough of Woodbine has made application to the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs 2008 Small Cities Community Development Block Grant Program Public Facilities Fund for funding in the amount of \$400,000 to go towards two projects: installation of a new municipal well and recreation improvements to Lincoln Park, Franklin Street Playground, and the Woodbine Community/School Recreation Center and multi-purpose field.

The new well will replace an existing well identified as having a limited remaining life span. This is one of only two wells that supply all of the water needs for the Borough of Woodbine.

The Borough also proposes to reconstruct, as necessary, the basketball and tennis courts and baseball fields at Lincoln Park. The fields will be redesigned to allow for installation of an outfield fence as required for Little League play. A new T-ball field will be reconstructed at the Franklin Street Playground. A multi-purpose field will be renovated at the Woodbine Community/School Complex. Bleachers, lockers, and benches will be purchased to complete the new Recreation Center.

“These projects will enhance both the safety and welfare of our Borough residents, both by securing our water supply for the future and by upgrading our recreational facilities,” concluded Mayor Pikolycky. “Grants such as this request have allowed us to go forward with a number of large capital projects without the necessity of placing additional burdens on the local tax payers.”
