Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that the Borough of Woodbine has made two applications, totaling approximately \$2.5 million for Fiscal Year 2009 Federal Appropriations.

The first, in the amount of \$1,970,000, requests funding to for enhance facilities within the community school complex for use as a multi-use community center. Upgrading the HVAC system, plumbing and kitchen and bathroom fixtures, and windows, purchase and installation of an emergency power generator, installation of new doors and a center-wide security system were other requested upgrades. This would become the Borough's matching funds for a \$4 million facility upgrade project on the previously existing portions of the school.

The second, in the amount of \$438,500, was for the airport business park water main extension. Installation of water mains is essential to the park's development and to provide adequate fire protection to both the Business Park and adjacent Woodbine Airport which serves as an emergency evacuation and staging area.

"I thank our United State Senators Lautenberg and Menendez for making us aware of and supporting this funding opportunity," added Mayor Pikolycky. "Congressman LoBiondo joins them in supporting these applications. Woodbine was a past recipient of Federal funding in the amount of \$250,000 for the Community School Complex."
