WOODBINE APPLIES FOR ADDITIONAL STREETSCAPE FUNDS

Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that the Borough of Woodbine has made application to the New Jersey Department of Transportation for discretionary aid in the amount of \$49,132.25, for completion of a previously NJDOT-funded road project improvement project for portions of Franklin and Clay Streets, which an integral part of the Borough's streetscape project.

When the project was bid, the State allocation was insufficient to award that portion of Franklin Street between Washington and Adams Avenues. As this is the section of roadway that connects the Borough's downtown area with its adjacent shoulder commercial area, and further serves as an interconnect between prior NJDOT projects that are part of the overall streetscape improvement, the current application seeks funding for completion of this project as originally planned.

"The Department of Transportation has been instrumental by its past funding in allowing Woodbine to continue its program of infrastructure improvement, and we are hopeful that they will look favorably on this application which would tie together previous endeavors," noted Mayor Pikolycky. "Woodbine is completing the punchlist for the last phase of brickpaving portion of the streetscape project."
