“SUNSET LECTURE WITH DR. HASIA R. DINER” AT THE SAM AZEEZ MUSEUM OF WOODBINE HERITAGE

Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce Dr. Hasia R. Diner, Paul S. and Sylvia Steinberg Professor of American Jewish History and Professor of Hebrew and Judaic Studies at New York University, will be giving a “Sunset Lecture” at the Sam Azeez Museum of Woodbine Heritage, 610 Woodbine, on Tuesday, August 19, at 6 p.m.

Her talk will be a fascinating exploration of the role of food in immigration, particularly for the Jewish community. Most recently seen in the PBS documentary *The Jewish Americans*, Dr. Diner is the author of *Hungering for America: Italian, Irish and Jewish Foodways in the Age of Migration*.

Dr. Diner is serving as the New Jersey Council for the Humanities’ State Scholar for *Key Ingredients*, the Smithsonian traveling exhibit that is currently in Woodbine.
