IRENE FITZPATRICK HONORED FOR FORTY-ONE YEARS AT CRMC

Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky issued a Proclamation honoring longtime Woodbine resident Irene Fitzpatrick on her retirement from Cape Regional Medical Center, Cape May Court House, where she was currently the second longest serving employee.

She was honored on March 28 by a reception at the Medical Center, at which time she was presented with the Proclamation.
