Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky reminds Woodbine residents that the annual rabies clinic, free to Borough residents and sponsored by the Borough of Woodbine, will be held Saturday, March 1, from 10 a.m. to noon, at the Woodbine Ambulance Corps Building/Public Safety facility on DeHirsch Avenue.

For the convenience of Borough residents, licenses may be obtained at Borough Hall the day of the clinic until 1 p.m. Proof of current rabies vaccination must be presented.

“We are pleased to be able to provide this service to our Borough residents and their pets, both cats and dogs,” remarked Mayor Pikolycky.

“The funds for these shots are made available through the purchase of dog and cat licenses, and are a cost savings to pet owners taking advantage of this program.”

“Paws and Claws will be distributing coupons for free spay or neuter for any dogs being licensed for the first time. These coupons will be offered to the first twenty-five qualifying canines licensed during the month of March.”

Licenses can be obtained from the Municipal Clerk at Borough Hall, 501 Washington Avenue, Monday through Friday, from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.

All cats and dogs in the Borough must be licensed.

License fees for dogs are \$8.20 if spayed or neutered; \$11.20 if not.

Cats \$5, regardless.

If purchased after Mar. 31, a \$5 late fee will be added.
