WOODBINE BOROUGH RECEIVING BIDS ON \$140,000 DOT PROJECT

Woodbine--Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that the Borough of Woodbine has scheduled a bid opening for April 16, 2008, at 10 a.m. for a road reconstruction project reconstructing/resurfacing portions of Franklin Street and Clay Street. Major components of the completed project include roadway construction, roadway resurfacing, concrete curb, concrete gutter, as well as topsoil and seed restoration.

The New Jersey Department of Transportation Municipal Aid program awarded the Borough of Woodbine a grant in the amount of \$140,000 for reconstruction of portions of Franklin Street and Clay Street.

This project will be an extension of previous DOT Local Aid projects. Both Clay Street and Franklin Street are immediately adjacent to the proposed third phase of the Washington Avenue streetscape project. Franklin and Clay are busy routes adjacent to the commercial district and provide access from the adjoining residential neighborhoods, serving as major access routes between a residential zone and the town center.

"We expect the contract to be awarded at Borough Council's April 17 meeting, with construction to begin approximately 30 days after award," added Mayor Pikolycky, "I again want to thank the Department of Transportation for making these funds available to keep our road network in good condition."
