WOODBINE BOROUGH BEGINS WORK ON TWO ROADWAY RECONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that two projects in the Borough of Woodbine, totaling approximately \$300,000, are set to begin construction shortly.

The first, roadway reconstruction, concrete repairs to sidewalks, and repairs to concrete gutters, will be on portions of Franklin Street between Washington and Adams Avenues. Work will be done by Ricky Slade Construction, Inc., Bridgeton, and will begin construction on Monday June 15. It will also include the planting of several trees as part of our ongoing "urban forest". This project is being funded under a \$46,000 grant from the New Jersey Department of Transportation's Transportation Trust Fund.

The second, road reconstruction project will begin approximately a week later. This will consist of reconstruction of the entrance road to the Woodbine Municipal Airport (Henry DeCinque Boulevard), including total reconstruction of the roadway, concrete curbs at the entranceway, and drainage upgrades. Work is being done by Jerry & Sons Excavating, Inc., Mays Landing. This project is also being funded under a New Jersey Department of Transportation's Transportation Trust Fund, grant in the amount of \$225,000.

"As we again thank the Department of Transportation for providing these funds, allowing our community to continue to improve upon its infrastructure, I also want to note that this construction continues to stimulate the local economy and to improve our overall infrastructure in terms of public safety and aesthetics," commented Mayor Pikolycky.
