Woodbine—Mayor William Pikolycky is pleased to announce that the Borough of Woodbine has received a discretionary aid funding award from the New Jersey department of transportation in the amount of \$149,000 for reconstruction of the roadway along Sherman Avenue.

Sherman Avenue is currently a dirt and gravel road which is one of the last unpaved municipal roads in the Borough. It connects with County Route 660 (Fidler Hill Road). This roadway is utilized by Borough residents. Construction of a new road surface and drainage system would provide improved access to not only the neighboring residents but will aid local traffic as well as emergency personnel.

“We are pleased to have these additional funds so that this necessary project may continue,” added Mayor Pikolycky. “Again, I thank NJDOT for all its support in partnering with Woodbine’s infrastructure maintenance endeavors. I cannot overemphasize the importance of the Transportation Trust Fund as it continues to provide much needed funding to communities such as Woodbine without increasing the burden of local property taxes. ”
